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


Dear Governor Pawlenty:

Re: Obsolete Rules Report

Minnesota Statues § 14.05, subd. 5, directs state agencies to report to you by December 1 of each year whether any of their rules are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules. The Minnesota Higher Education Services Office has reviewed its rules and found that the following rules are obsolete.

We are seeking repeal of the following rules as the statutes funding these programs were repealed during the 2003 legislative session:

- *Minnesota Rules*, parts 4830.8100 to 4830.8150, relating to state postsecondary education grants for students participating in advanced placement and international baccalaureate programs.
- *Minnesota Rules*, parts 4815.0100 to 4815.0160, relating to postsecondary post-service benefits for persons who have successfully completed a youth works program.



The Services Office sought repeal of these rules during the 2004 legislative session, but the session ended before this was addressed. The Services Office will seek repeal again during the 2005 session.
