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REVISOR OF STATUTES

Subject: 2002 Annual Report on Obsolete, Unnecessary, or Duplicative Rules, as Required by Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5.

Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5, states:

By December 1 of each year, an agency must submit to the governor, the legislative coordinating commission, the policy and funding committees and divisions with jurisdiction over the agency, and the revisor of statutes, a list of any rules or portions of rules that are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules. The list must also include an explanation of why the rule or portion of the rule is obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules. By December 1, the agency must either report a timetable for repeal of the rule or portion of the rule, or must develop a bill for submission to the appropriate policy committee to repeal the obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative rule. Such a bill must include proposed authorization to use the expedited procedures of section 14.389 to repeal or amend the obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative rule. A report submitted under this subdivision must be signed by the person in the agency who is responsible for identifying and initiating repeal of obsolete rules. The report also must identify the status of any rules identified in the prior year's report as obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative. If none of an agency's rules are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative, an agency's December report must state that conclusion.

We have identified the following rules that are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative and should be repealed:

Minnesota Rules, part 4690.1500, subpart 3 – Ambulances in Service Before June 30, 1981

Minnesota Rules, part 4690.7900, subpart 6 – Extension of Renewal Date

Minn. R. 4690.1500, subpart 3 is obsolete because there are few if any ambulance vehicles still in active use in the state that were placed into service prior to 1981.


Minn. R. 4690.7900, subpart 6 is obsolete because it was intended to address the temporary gap in licensure created for ambulance services in 1982 when the current ambulance renewal system was first implemented.

The above-referenced rules are to be included for repeal in the EMSRB-proposed 2003 legislation.

In the 2002 report, we identified the above referenced rules for repeal, however, no action was taken on the EMSRB 2002 proposed legislation. Therefore, this 2002 report once again includes the above-referenced rules for repeal in the EMSRB 2003 proposed legislation.
