RE: Annual Report on Obsolete, Unnecessary, or Duplicative Rules as Required by Minnesota Statutes Section 14.05, Subdivision 5.

Dear Governor Dayton, Senators, Representatives and Revisor Timmons:

Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5, directs state agencies to report to you by December 1 of each year whether any of their rules are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules.

The Minnesota Department of Commerce has reviewed its rules. Except for the provisions discussed below, we can identify no rules that are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative and that should be repealed.

In last year's report (attached), we identified the following Minnesota Rules as being obsolete, unnecessary or duplicative:

- Minn. Rules, chapter 7607 (bond fund program for Energy Conservation Investment Loans)
- Minn. Rules, chapter 7685 (cooling systems standards)
- Minn. Rules, parts 3300.0800 – 3300.1900 (state weatherization assistance program – implementation by Department of Employment and Economic Development)
- Minn. Rules 7610.0300 (electric utilities required to file extended forecasts)
- Minn. Rules 2675.2170(F) (maximum time period for holding certain real estate as an asset)
- Minn. Rules 2675.0400 (preferential repayment for sale treatment qualification)

Legislation that was introduced in the 2011 session by the Department was successful in repealing 2675.2170(F), but the Department was not successful in removing the remaining provisions. The Department intends to introduce legislation in the 2012 session that addresses the repeal of the remaining provisions included in last year's report.
