


GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL-

To use a hunting license or coupon of another person.

To hunt in any state park or game refuge, or to carry firearms thereon except by permission of Director of Game and Fish.

To take any migratory game birds with a rifle or pistol or in any other way than with a shotgun not larger than a ten (10) gauge fired from the shoulder or with bow and arrow. To take migratory game birds with automatic loading or hand operated repeating shotguns capable of holding more than three shells at one time in the magazine and chamber combined.

To shoot game from a motor vehicle or to carry firearms therein except they are taken apart or contained in a case, unloaded in both barrels and magazine.

To bait hunting grounds for the purpose of taking migratory waterfowl or mourning doves.

To use live decoys in hunting migratory waterfowl.

To ship, transport or carry upland or migratory game birds with their heads or feet removed.

To transport Christmas trees without a bill of sale from the land owner showing legal description from whence trees were cut, or bearing Forestry Division Tag.

STATE PUBLIC SHOOTING GROUNDS

Public Shooting Grounds on which hunting is allowed are subject to special regulations. These regulations can be obtained from the Division of Game and Fish or on the areas concerned.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Do not fail to report to the Division of Game and Fish the kinds and numbers of game birds and mammals taken under your hunting license each year. If no game is obtained, that report must be made as well. Convenient cards for this purpose are attached to hunting licenses. Return these cards not later than January 31st.

The information obtained from these reports is valuable and, therefore, in the interests of good hunting, be sure to make your report promptly.

Report banded birds according to instructions on the band. Give all data possible, including date, place, and manner of recovering band.

PHEASANTS-AREA OPEN: (State Wide).

RUFFED GROUSE

AREA OPEN: In all of that area lying north and east of the system of highways, described as follows:

Starting on the border line between the Province of Manitoba and Minnesota, where it is intersected by the county road due north of Roseau, Minnesota, thence southerly along said county road to Roseau, thence southerly and westerly on state trunk highway number 11 to Greenbush, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 32 to Thief River Falls, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 59 to Detroit Lakes, Minnesota, thence southerly and easterly on highway number 10 to St. Cloud, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 95 to Taylors Falls on the Wisconsin-Minnesota boundary.

PRAIRIE CHICKEN (PINNATED GROUSE) AND SHARP-TAIL (WHITE-BREASTED) GROUSE (N. W. ZONE)

AREA OPEN: In all that area lying within the following described lines and system of highways:

Commencing at the extreme northwesterly corner of the state, proceeding southerly along the North Dakota-Minnesota boundary line to Oslo in Marshall County, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 1 to Thief River Falls, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 59 to Waubun in Mahnomen County, thence easterly on highway number 113 to its intersection with highway number 71 in Hubbard County, thence northerly and easterly on highway number 71 to its intersection with highway number 85, thence easterly on highway number 85 to its intersection with highway number 371, thence southerly on highway number 371 to Walker in Cass County, thence easterly on highway number 34 to Remer, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 6 to Garrison, Minnesota, thence following the westerly and southerly shore of Mille Lacs Lake to Isle, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 66 to its intersection with highway number 65, thence southerly on highway number 65 to Mora, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 23 to its intersection with highway number 61. thence northerly on highway number 61 to Hinckley, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 48 to the Minnesota-Wisconsin border, thence northerly along said border to Duluth, Minnesota, thence westerly on highway number 210 to Cromwell, Minnesota, thence northerly on highway number 73 to its intersection with highway number 53, and continuing north on highway 53 to International Falls, Minnesota, thence westerly along the Minnesota-Canadian boundary line to the point of beginning.

PRAIRIE CHICKEN (PINNATED GROUSE) AND SHARP-TAIL (WHITE-BREASTED) GROUSE (N. E. ZONE)

Commencing at International Falls, thence southerly on highway number 53 to its intersection with highway number 73, continuing southerly on highway number 73 to Cromwell in Carlton County, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 210 to Duluth, Minnesota, thence northeasterly along the shore of Lake Superior to the Canadian boundary, thence westerly along the Canadian-Minnesota boundary line to the point of beginning.

HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE-NORTHERN ZONE

AREA OPEN: That area within the following described lines: Starting at the extreme northwesterly corner of the state, proceeding southerly along the North Dakota-Minnesota boundary line to Oslo in Marshall County, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 1 to Thief River Falls, thence northerly along highway number 32 to Greenbush, thence northeasterly on highway number 11 to Roseau, thence straight north along the county road to the Manitoba-Minnesota border line, thence westerly to the point of beginning along the Manitoba-Minnesota line.

HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE-SOUTHERN ZONE

AREA OPEN: That area contained within the following described boundary:

Commencing at the North Dakota-Minnesota state line at Oslo in Marshall County, Minnesota, thence easterly on highway number 1 to Thief River Falls, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 59 to Detroit Lakes, Minnesota, thence southeasterly on highway number 10 to Wadena, thence southdy on highway number 29 to Montevideo in Chippewa County, thence southeasterly on highway number 212 to Granite Falls, Minnesota, thence southerly on highway number 23 to Marshall, Minnesota, thence continuing southerly on highway number 59 to Slayton, Minnesota, thence westerly on highway number 47 to the South Dakota-Minnesota boundary line, thence northerly along said South Dakota-Minnesota and North Dakota-Minnesota boundary lines to the point of beginning.

QUAIL

AREA OPEN: Hennepin, Carver, Scott, Dakota, LeSueur, Rice, Goodhue, Wabasha, Winona, Fillmore, Houston, Olmsted, Washington, and upon the regularly prescribed public hunting grounds of the Carlos-Avery area in Anoka and Chisago Counties.

CLOSED SEASON

CHUKAR PARTRIDGE, CANADA SPRUCE GROUSE, WILD TURKEY, UPLAND PLOVER, SHOREBIRDS (except Woodcock) CRANE, WOOD DUCK, JACKSNIPE, ROSS'S GEESE, and SWAN may not be killed at any time.

GRAY AND FOX SQUIRREL AND RABBIT AREA OPEN: All counties except Ramsey County.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

AGGREGATE SEASON LIMIT: Not more than 30 in the aggregate of pheasant, ruffec grouse, quail, prairie chicken and sharptail grouse may be taken.

POSSESSION OF GAME AFTER CLOSE OF SEASON:

All game to be retained must be tagged by Director or Game Warden within five (5) days after the close of the season. Migratory game birds if properly tagged may be retained only 20 days after the close of the season during which they were taken. Upland game birds, except migratory game birds, may be retained if tagged until April 30 following the open season in which they were taken.

LICENSE PROVISIONS

RESIDENT: Small game hunting license, One Dollar (\$1.00), required of residents sixteen years of age or over, must be purchased in the county in which the applicant resides. NON-RESIDENT: Small game hunting license, Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), required of all non-residents.

FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD HUNTING STAMP REQUIREMENT

It is unlawful for any person over sixteen (16) years of age to take migratory waterfowl without having on his person a Migratory-bird Hunting Stamp validated by writing his signature in ink across the face of it. These stamps are sold at \$1.00 each and may be bought at post offices and at other points convenient to waterfowl centers.

GAME BIRD SHIPPING PROVISIONS RESIDENT HUNTERS:

Each resident hunter may ship or transport during the open season by common carrier consigned to himself only at any point in the county of his residence, not more than three (3) shipments of game birds including not more than twelve (12) waterfowl, rails, or shore birds combined, and not more than three (3) upland game birds in each of the three (3) shipments.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the resident small game hunting license.

NON-RESIDENT HUNTERS:

Each non-resident hunter may ship or transport by common carrier during the open season to a point within or without the state, consigned to himself only, one shipment only, including not more than twenty-five (25) game birds of all kinds combined according to the possession limits described above.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the non-resident small game hunting license.

TRAPPING REGULATIONS: MINK:

Dates: November 1st to January 31st, both dates inclusive. SKUNK:

Dates: October 20th to March 1st, both dates inclusive. RACCOON:

Dates: November 1st to December 1st, both dates inclusive. BEAVER AND MUSKRAT:

Season may be opened by order of the commissioner. Watch newspapers for announcements.

BADGER, OTTER, FISHER, MARTEN: No open season.

LICENSE PROVISIONS: Trapping license, issued only to residents, must be obtained in the county where applicant resides, one dollar (\$1.00).

GENERAL INFORMATION:

It Is Unlawful—

To hunt raccoon with a dog in territory inhabited or frequented by deer.

To molest or take raccoon in any manner in a den or hollow tree.

To cut down tree inhabited or occupied by raccoon.

To set trap for raccoon in or under water or in any muskrat runway.

- To set traps for mink in muskrat houses or runways.
- To dig mink from dens.
- To take mink with the aid of dogs.

To retain pelts of fur-bearing animals more than five days after the close of the season without retaining tag issued by the Director or game warden.

SHIPPING PROVISIONS:

When shipping furs taken under trapping license, the parcel must be plainly marked on the outside stating the name, address and license number of shipper and kind and number of skins contained in the package. When skins taken on one's own land are shipped, package should be marked, "Taken on my own land", in addition to stating the kind and number of skins contained therein.

HELP PREVENT ACCIDENTS

LEARN to shoot and handle a gun by practice before hunting. ADOPT the slogan "All Guns Are Always Loaded." CARELESS shooting endangers the lives of others. BE SURE to identify your target before you shoot.

HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

BE CAREFUL with burning cigars, cigarettes, and pipe coals. BE SURE your match is out before you throw it away. REPORT fires to nearest forest ranger or game warden.

PUT YOUR CAMP FIRE OUT WITH WATER.

Longitude of St. Paul, Minn.





HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE-SOUTHERN ZONE

AREA OPEN: That area contained within the following described boundaries: Commencing at the North Dakota-Minnesota state line at Moorhead, Minnesota, thence southerly along said state line to Highway No. 14 in Lincoln County, thence easterly along Highway No. 14 to its junction with Highway No. 59 in Lyon County, thence northerly along Highway No. 59 to Marshall, Minnesota, thence northerly on Highway No. 17 to its junction with Highway No. 212 near Granite Falls, Minnesota, thence northerly on Highway No. 212 to Montevideo, thence northerly on Highway No. 29 through Glenwood and Alexandria to Wadena, thence northwesterly and westerly on Highway No. 10 to Moorhead, the point of beginning.

AREA OPEN: All counties except Ramsey County.

CLOSE SEASON

CHUKAR PARTRIDGE, CANADA SPRUCE GROUSE, WILD TURKEY, UPLAND PLOVER, SHOREBIRDS (except Woodcock and Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe) CRANE, WOOD DUCK and SWAN may not be killed at any time.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

AGGREGATE DAILY LIMIT: Not more than fifteen (15) game birds of all kinds combined may be taken by any one person in any one day.

AGGREGATE SEASON LIMIT: Not more than 30 in the aggregate of pheasant, ruffed grouse, quail, prairie chicken and sharptail grouse may be taken.

POSSESSION OF GAME AFTER CLOSE OF SEASON:

All game to be retained must be tagged by Director or Game Warden within five (5) days after the close of the season. FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD HUNTING STAMP REQUIREMENT

It is unlawful for any person over sixteen (16) years of age to take migratory waterfowl without having on his person a Migratory-bird Hunting Stamp validated by writing his signature in ink across the face of it. These stamps are sold at \$1.00 each and may be bought at first and second-class post offices and at other points convenient to waterfowl centers.

GAME BIRD SHIPPING PROVISIONS

RESIDENT HUNTERS:

Each resident hunter may ship or transport during the open season by common carrier consigned to himself only at any point in the county in which he obtained his small game hunting license, not more than three (3) shipments of game birds including not more than twelve (12) waterfowl, rails, or shore birds combined, and not more than three (3) upland game birds in each of the three (3) shipments.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the resident small game hunting license.

NON-RESIDENT HUNTERS:

Each non-resident hunter may ship or transport by common carrier during the open season to a point within or without the state, consigned to himself only, one shipment only, including not more than twenty-five (25) game birds of all kinds combined according to the possession limits described above.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the non-resident small game hunting license.





GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL-

To use a hunting license or coupon of another person.

To hunt in any state park or game refuge, or to carry firearms thereon except by permission. To take any migratory game birds with a rifle or pistol or in any other way than with a shot-gun not larger than a ten (10) gauge fired from the shoulder or with bow and arrow.

To take migratory game birds with automatic loading or hand operated repeating shotguns capable of holding more than three shells at one time in the magazine and chamber combined. To shoot game from a motor vehicle or to carry firearms therein except they are taken apart or contained in a case, unloaded in both barrels and magazine.

To bait hunting grounds for the purpose of taking migratory waterfowl and mourning doves. To use live decoys in hunting migratory waterfowl. To transport any protected game or parts thereof. in any receptacle unless tagged with contents, license number, name of consignor and consignee plainly marked on the outside of such package. To transport Christmas trees without a bill of sale from the land owner showing legal description from whence trees were cut.

STATE PUBLIC SHOOTING GROUNDS

Public Shooting Grounds on which hunting is allowed are subject to special regulations. These regulations can be obtained from the Division of Game and Fish or on the areas concerned.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Do not fail to report to the Division of Game and Fish the kinds and numbers of game birds and mammals taken under your hunting license each year. If no game is obtained, that report should be made as well. Convenient cards for this purpose are attached to hunting licenses. Return these cards not later than January 31st.

The information obtained from these reports is valuable and, therefore, in the interests of good hunting, be sure to make your report promptly.

Report banded birds according to instructions on the band. Give all data possible, including date, place, and manner of recovering band.

PLEASE REMEMBER

To buy a hunting license and always carry it with you when hunting.

To study and observe the game laws.

To be careful with firearms. Always unload your gun when not actually hunting.

To be courteous and to respect the rights of farmers and other hunters.

To protect game and cover by preventing forest and brush fires. Be careful where you throw cigarettes and matches.



Motor boats and boats with outboard motors can be used for transportation to and from the hunting grounds. Any boating whatsoever done for the purpose of assisting other persons in attempting to take migratory birds is prohibited. No shooting can be done from a motor powered boat at any time unless the motor is entirely removed from the boat and then only when the boat is within a natural growth of weeds, rushes, flags or other vegetation sufficient to partially conceal the hunter.

Entering open water for the purpose and with the intention of causing a flight of birds resting thereon is prohibited.

USE OF BLINDS WHILE HUNTING WATERFOWL

Waterfowl may be taken during the open season from permanent or temporary stationary artificial blinds when located on land. Temporary blinds or boats without motors can be used on public waters when taking water-fowl only when the temporary blind or boat is located within a natural growth of weeds, rushes, flags or other vegetation sufficient to partially conceal the hunter.

A temporary blind is one designed to remain in location a short time only and is not supported or braced by posts or other substantial framework driven into or otherwise attached to the ground. A blind constructed by driving posts and building platforms thereon is not considered

to be of a temporary nature. A permanent blind is one designed to remain for successive use and is substantially supported or braced by posts or other framework driven into or otherwise attached to the ground.

- FOSSESSION OF GAME AFTER CLOSE OF SEASON: All game to be retained must be tagged by Director or Game Wardens within five (5) days after close of season. Migratory game may be retained if tagged until November 24, 1938. Upland game may be retained if tagged until January 10, 1939.

LICENSE PROVISIONS

RESIDENT: Small game hunting license, One dollar (\$1.00), required of residents sixteen years of age or over.

NON-RESIDENT: Small game hunting license, Twentyfive dollars (\$25.00), required of all non-residents.

GAME BIRD SHIPPING PROVISIONS

RESIDENT HUNTERS:

Each resident hunter may ship or transport during the open season by common carrier consigned to him self only at any point in the county in which he resides and in which he obtained his small game hunting license, not more than three (3) shipments of game birds including not more than twelve (12) waterfowl, rails, or shore birds combined, and not more than three (3) upland game birds in each of the three (3) shipments.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the resident small game hunting license.

NON-RESIDENT HUNTERS

Each non-resident hunter may ship or transport by common carrier during the open season to a point within or without the state, consigned to himself only, one shipment only including not more than twenty-five (25) game birds of all kinds combined according to the possession limits described above.

The licensee must attach the proper license coupons to the game birds submitted for shipment in the manner described on the non-resident small game hunting license.

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL-

To use a hunting license or coupon of another person. To hunt in any state park or game refuge, or to carry firearms thereon except by permission.

To take any waterfowl or woodcock with a rifle or pistol or in any other way than with a shotgun not larger than a ten (10) gauge fired from the shoulder or with bow and arrow.

To take migratory birds with automatic loading or hand operated repeating shotgun holding more than three shells.

To bait hunting grounds for the purpose of taking migratory waterfowl.

To use live decoys in hunting migratory waterfowl. To ship game birds without coupon from license attached.

To ship game birds to any county other than the county in which the license is issued.

To ship more than three upland game birds on any one resident shipping coupon.

To transport any protected game or parts thereof in any receptacle unless tagged with contents, license number, name of consignor and consignee plainly marked on the outside of such package.

To shoot game from a motor vehicle or to carry firearms therein except they are taken apart or contained in a case, unloaded in both barrels and magazine. To retain game more than five days after close of season unless tagged by director or game warden. To transport Christmas trees without a bill of sale from the land owner showing legal description from whence trees were cut.

Only 3 of any one or 3 combined of canvasback, redhead, bufflehead or ruddy duck may be included in the daily bag and only 6 of any one or 6 combined of the species named may be included in the possession limit. Wood duck, swans, yellowlegs may not be taken at any time.


IMPORTANT NOTICE

Do not fail to report to the Division of Game and Fish the kinds and numbers of game birds and mammals taken under your hunting license each year. If no game is obtained, that report should be made as well. Convenient cards for this purpose are attached to hunting licenses. Return these cards not later than January 31st.

The information obtained from these reports is very valuable and, therefore, in the interests of good hunting, be sure to make your report promptly.

Report banded birds according to instructions on the band. Give all information possible, including date, place, and manner of recovering the band.

Note: These regulations are subject to change. Watch newspapers for further announcements.



MINNESOTA HUNTER'S CODE

Buy a hunting license and always carry it when hunting. Study the game laws and decide to live up to them.

Learn to shoot and handle a gun by practice before you go hunting.

Pick an experienced hunting companion-if you lack experience.

Do not use intoxicating beverages on a hunting trip.

Respect the speed limits as you travel through towns.

When driving be careful of children, and domestic animals.

Do not hunt near towns or villages---illegal.

Always ask for the privilege of hunting on a farm-posted or not posted-first introducing yourself, giving name and address.

If permission is granted, inquire of the occupant if there is any portion he does not wish you to hunt on—because of growing crops, stock, etc. Ask the farmer to hunt with you.

Park your car out of the way in the yard-be quiet.

Do not honk horn to attract attention of occupants of a house.

If game is found, be reasonable, leave some for the next man.

Upon returning to the car show your kill, if any, to the farmer, and offer him a portion.

If investigation shows no one at home on a farm-do not hunt.

Prevent your dog from chasing stock-do not kill cats on farms.

Do not discharge firearms within 200 yards of a farm home, near domestic animals—especially those in harness, or from a highway.

Do not climb over fences; crawl under or use the gate where possible. Close all gates securely, when found closed.

Report all damage you may do while hunting or that you will find has been done.

Never hunt in a sneaking manner—hunting is manly when conducted in a legal and proper manner. Always ask permission.

Rowdyism and vandalism have no place in a sportsman's program.

Protect our hunting privileges-observe the golden rule. Co-operate with the game wardens-they are serving you.

Never post land you do not own or lease,

Learn to distinguish our game and always know what you are shooting at before you shoot.

Leave a clean camp. Be careful of your cigarets and matches.

Adopt the slogan "All guns are always loaded." Advertise and live up to this code.

Advertise and five up to this code.

Report all game killed each year to the commissioner of game.

PHEASANT SEASON

DATES: From noon to 5:00 P. M. each day, October 16th to October 24th, both dates inclusive, in the following counties:

Traverse, Grant, Douglas, Big Stone, Stevens, Pope, Stearns, Sherburne, Swift, Kandiyohi, Meeker, Wright, Hennepin, Anoka, Washington, Lac qui Parle, Chippewa, Yellow Medicine, Renville, Mc-Leod, Carver, Lincoln, Lyon, Redwood, Brown, Nicollet, Sibley, Le Sueur, Scott, Rice, Dakota, Goodhue, Wabasha, Pipestone, Murray, Cottonwood, Watonwan, Blue Earth, Waseca, Steele, Dodge, Olmsted, Winona, Rock, Nobles, Jackson, Martin, Faribault, Freeborn, Mower, Fillmore, and Houston,

All other counties closed.

BAG LIMIT: Three (3) male birds or two (2) males and one (1) female may be taken by one person in any one day. Five (5) male birds or four (4) males and one (1) female may be in possession of one person at any one time. The season limit is ten (10) male birds or eight (8) males and two (2) females per person.

QUAIL SEASON

DATES: From 7:00 A. M. to 5:00 P. M. each day, October 30th to November 7th, both dates inclusive, in the following counties:

Wabasha, Winona, Olmsted, Fillmore, and Houston. All other counties closed.

- **BAG LIMIT:** Daily limit six (6) per person. Possession limit twelve (12) per person. Season limit eighteen (18) per person.
- Partridge or Ruffed Grouse, White Breasted or Sharptail Grouse, Prairie Chicken or Pinnated Grouse, Chukar Partridge, Hungarian Partridge, Upland Plover, Woodcock and Mourning Dove

No open season.

MIGRATORY BIRDS

DUCKS, GEESE, COOTS, WILSON'S SNIPE OR JACKSNIPE, RAILS AND GALLINULES.

- **DATES:** From 7:00 A. M. to 4:00 P. M. each day, October 9th to November 7th, both dates inclusive.
- **BAG LIMITS:** Daily limit, fifteen (15) in the aggregate of all kinds, of which not more than ten (10) shall be ducks, not more than four (4) shall be geese, not more than twelve (12) shall be coots, not more than twelve (12) shall be Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, and not more than twelve (12) in the aggregate shall be rails and gallinules (except coot).

- **POSSESSION LIMIT:** Thirty (30) in the aggregate of all kinds, of which not more than ten (10) shall be ducks, not more than five (5) shall be geese, not more than twenty-five (25) shall be coots, not more than fifteen (15) shall be wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, not more than fifteen (15) in the aggregate shall be rails and gallinules (except coot).
- **EXCEPTIONS:** The taking of wood duck, ruddy duck, bufflehead duck, redhead duck, canvasback duck, swans, greater and lesser yellowlegs, during the year 1937 is prohibited.

NOTE: Besides the State small game hunting license, a person over sixteen years of age must have on his person an unexpired Federal migratory bird hunting stamp, validated by his signature written across the face thereof in ink, in order to take migratory waterfowl.

GENERAL PROVISIONS:

Not more than fifteen (15) game birds of all kinds in the aggregate may be taken by any one person in any one day.

GRAY AND FOX SQUIRREL SEASON

DATES: May be taken from October 15th to January 1st following, both dates inclusive.

BAG LIMIT: Seven (7) in the aggregate per person in any one day. A person may have not to exceed fourteen (14) in the aggregate in possession.

LICENSE PROVISIONS:

Resident small game hunting license, one dollar (\$1.00), required of residents sixteen years of age or over. Non-resident small game hunting license, twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), required of all nonresidents.

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL:

To use a hunting license or coupon of another person.

To hunt in any state park or game refuge, or to carry firearms thereon except by permission.

- To take any waterfowl with a rifle or pistol or in any other way than with a shotgun not larger than a ten (10) gauge fired from the shoulder or with bow and arrow.
- To take migratory birds with automatic loading or hand operated repeating shotgun holding more than three shells.
- To bait hunting grounds for the purpose of taking ducks.

To use live decoys in hunting migratory waterfowl. To ship game birds without coupon from license attached.

To ship game birds to any county other than the county in which the license is issued.

- To ship more than three upland game birds on any one shipping coupon.
- To transport any protected game or parts thereof in any receptacle unless tagged with contents and license number, name of consignor and consignee plainly marked on the outside of such package.
- To shoot game from a motor vehicle or to carry firearms therein except they are taken apart or contained in a case, unloaded in both barrels and magazine.

To retain game more than five days after close of season unless tagged by director or game warden.

TRAPPING SEASONS

MINK

DATES: From November 1st to February 15th, both dates inclusive.

SKUNK

DATES: From October 20th to May 1st, both dates inclusive.

RACCOON

DATES: From November 1st to December 1st, both dates inclusive.

MUSKRAT

Season to be determined later.

BEAVER, OTTER, FISHER,

MARTEN

No open season.

LICENSE PROVISIONS:

Trapping licenses issued to residents only, one dollar (\$1.00).

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL:

- To hunt raccoon with a dog in territory inhabited or frequented by deer.
- To molest or take raccoon in any manner in a den or hollow tree.
- To cut down tree inhabited or occupied by raccoon.
- To set traps for mink in muskrat houses or runways.
- To dig mink from dens.
- To take mink with the aid of dogs.

To retain pelts of fur-bearing animals more than five days after the close of the season without retaining tag issued by the director or game warden.

SHIPPING PROVISIONS:

When shipping furs taken under trapping license, the contents of the parcel must plainly be marked on the outside of the package stating the kind of skins contained therein. When skins taken on one's own land are shipped, package should be marked, "Taken on my own land," in addition to stating the kind of skins contained therein.
