

## MINNESOTA HUNTER'S CODE

Buy a hunting license and always carry it when hunting.

Study the game laws and decide to live up to them.

Learn to shoot and handle a gun by practice before you go hunting.

Pick an experienced hunting companion—if you lack experience.

Do not use intoxicating beverages on a hunting trip.

Respect the speed limits as you travel through towns.

When driving be careful of children, and domestic animals.

Do not hunt near towns or villages—illegal.

Always ask for the privilege of hunting on a farm—posted or not posted—first introducing yourself, giving name and address.

If permission is granted, inquire of the occupant if there is any portion he does not wish you to hunt on—because of growing crops, stock, etc. Ask the farmer to hunt with you.

Park your car out of the way in the yard—be quiet.

Do not honk horn to attract attention of occupants of a house.

If game is found, be reasonable, leave some for the next man.

Upon returning to the car show your kill, if any, to the farmer, and offer him a portion.

If investigation shows no one at home on a farm—do not hunt.

Prevent your dog from chasing stock—do not kill cats on farms.

Do not discharge firearms within 200 yards of a farm home, near domestic animals—especially those in harness, or from a highway.

Do not climb over fences; crawl under or use the gate where possible. Close all gates securely, when found closed.

Report all damage you may do while hunting or that you will find has been done.

Never run away from an approaching farmer in the field—all men despise a coward.

Never hunt in a sneaking manner—hunting is manly when conducted in a legal and proper manner. Always ask permission.

Rowdiness and vandalism have no place in a sportsman's program.

Protect our hunting privileges—observe the golden rule.

Co-operate with the game wardens—they are serving you.

Never post land you do not own or lease.

Learn to distinguish our game and always know what you are shooting at before you shoot.

Leave a clean camp. Be careful of your cigarets and matches.

Adopt the slogan "All guns are always loaded."

Advertise and live up to this code. Report all game killed each year to the commissioner of game.

## PHEASANT SEASON

### GROUP 1.

**DATES:** From noon to sunset each day commencing October 19th to October 27th, both dates inclusive, in the following counties: Houston, Fillmore, Mower, Freeborn, Winona, Olmsted, Dodge, Steele, Waseca, Wabasha, Kanabec, Pine, Carlton, Crow Wing, Cass, Hubbard, Clearwater, Becker, Mahnomens, Clay, Norman, Polk, Red Lake.

**BAG LIMIT:** Three (3) male birds in any one day, six male birds in possession at any one time.

### GROUP 2.

**DATES:** From noon to sunset each day, commencing October 19th to October 27th, both dates inclusive, and from November 9th to November 19th, both dates inclusive, in the following counties: Wilkin, Ottertail, Wadena, Todd, Morrison, Benton, Mille Lacs, Isanti, Chisago, Scott, Washington, Anoka, Sherburne, Stearns, Pope, Douglas, Grant, Stevens, Traverse, Dakota, Big Stone, Swift, Kandiyohi, Meeker, Wright, Hennepin, Carver, McLeod, Renville, Goodhue, Chippewa, Lac Qui Parle, Yellow Medicine, Lincoln, Lyon, Redwood, Brown, Nicollet, Sibley, Rice, Le Sueur, Blue Earth, Watwanan, Cottonwood, Murray, Pipestone, Rock, Nobles, Jackson, Martin, Faribault.

**BAG LIMIT:** Three (3) male birds or two (2) males and one (1) female in any one day, six (6) male birds or four (4) males and two (2) females in possession at any one time. Eighteen (18) birds for the season. All other counties closed.

## QUAIL

**DATES:** From noon to sunset each day commencing October 28th to November 19th, both dates inclusive, in the following counties: Houston, Winona, Olmsted, Wabasha, Rice, Le Sueur, Dakota, Scott, Sibley, McLeod, Carver, Wright, Sherburne. All other counties closed.

**BAG LIMIT:** Daily limit, 6. Possession limit, 12.

## PRAIRIE CHICKEN and WHITE BREASTED GROUSE

**DATES:** From September 21st to September 29th, both dates inclusive, from sunrise to sunset each day except the opening date, September 21st, commencing at twelve o'clock noon, in the following counties: Kanabec, Pine, Carlton, Aitkin, Lake, St. Louis, Itasca, Koochiching, Beltrami, Lake of the Woods, Pennington,

Marshall, Roseau, Kittson.

All other counties closed.

**BAG LIMIT:** Daily limit, 5; possession limit, 10; season limit, 18.

## RUFFED GROUSE or PARTRIDGE, MOURNING DOVE, UPLAND PLOVER and WOODCOCK

Ruffed grouse or partridge, mourning dove, upland plover and woodcock, no open season.

## MIGRATORY BIRDS

**DATES:** Commencing October 21st to November 19th, both dates inclusive, from seven (7) A. M. to four (4) P. M. daily except on October 21st, commencing at twelve o'clock noon.

**BAG LIMIT:** Daily limit, ten (10) in the aggregate of all kinds, of which not more than four shall be geese or brant. Possession limit—same.

The taking of woodduck, ruddy duck, buffhead, swan, greater and lesser yellow legs during the year 1935 is prohibited.

**NOTE:** Federal stamp of \$1.00 required for the shooting of migratory waterfowl.

Before hunting waterfowl, the hunter must validate his stamp by writing his signature in ink across the face of it.

## GENERAL PROVISIONS

Not more than fifteen (15) game birds of all kinds in the aggregate may be taken by any one person in one day.

## LICENSE PROVISIONS

Resident small game hunting license one dollar (\$1.00), required of all residents sixteen years or over.

Non-resident small game hunting license twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), required of all non-residents.

## GENERAL RESTRICTIONS

IT IS UNLAWFUL:

To use a hunting license or coupon of another person.

To hunt in any state park or game refuge, or to carry firearms thereon except by permission.

To take any waterfowl with a rifle or pistol or in any other way than with a shotgun not larger than a ten (10) gauge fired from the shoulder or with bow and arrow.

To take migratory birds with automatic loading or hand operated repeating shotgun holding more than three shells.

To bait hunting grounds for the purpose of taking ducks.

To use live decoys in hunting migratory waterfowl.

To transport any protected game or parts thereof in any receptacle unless tagged and contents with license number, name of consignor and consignee plainly marked on the outside of such package.

To shoot game from a motor vehicle or to carry firearms therein except they are taken apart or contained in a case, unloaded in both barrels and magazine.

To retain game more than five days after close of season unless tagged by director or game wardens.

## SUN RISE AND SUN SET SCHEDULE Longitude of St. Paul, Minn.

Variation approximately 4 minutes to each degree. Add to determine time for points west, and subtract for points east of St. Paul.
