MRAC VISION

We believe that:

- The arts strengthen communities;
- The arts stimulate diversity of expression, communication, and commemoration of communities and cultures; and
- All people should have opportunities to engage in the arts.

Accordingly, MRAC's vision for the region is that:

- Artists, arts organizations and arts activities thrive.
- Art is integrated into the social fabric and identity of every community.
- Public value of the arts is understood and acted upon by community members, leaders and policy makers.

MRAC MISSION

The Metropolitan Regional Arts Council increases access to the arts in 7-county metropolitan area communities by providing information, organizational support, and grants.

MRAC GOALS

- MRAC will provide grant applicants and other constituents with clear, thorough, prompt and respectful service and assistance.
- MRAC will maintain transparent decision-making processes, and accessible public information.
- MRAC's programs and services will reflect its Mission, and achieve its Vision.

GRANTS PROGRAMS

In FY 2016, MRAC received 905 applications and awarded 467 grants totaling \$3,146,433 to organizations, which includes two grants for an Arts Achievement Award. The final grant total also includes a \$195,000 grant to VSA Minnesota for their role in re-granting ADA Access Improvement Grants for Metro arts organizations, which resulted in 16 grants.

In addition MRAC received 484 applications from individual artists in the Next Step Fund program and awarded 37 grants totaling \$174,666 with a grant from The McKnight Foundation. MRAC also provided 11 arts management training sessions, 30 grant application workshops and 33 panelist orientation workshops.

Our Biennial Plan described 11 grant programs for FY 2016. Below is a brief description of each, with comments on any variances of actual activities. Please note that the

overarching legacy goal(s) that each program and service addresses appear below in *italics*. The first four programs, while not specifically referred to as general operating support, provide funding for the costs of arts activities, including related administrative costs, that eligible applicant groups produce. These four programs, which collectively constitute <u>91%</u> of MRAC's State-funded grant making, most closely address MRAC's mission of increasing access to the arts in the region.

• Arts Activities Support Grants

Grants of up to \$10,000 for arts projects. There were two rounds of Arts Activities Support grants in FY 2016.

The arts are interwoven into every facet of community life.

People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts.

The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total budget: \$1,356,000; \$125,271 from General Fund Appropriation, \$1,230,729 from Arts & Cultural Heritage Fund.

Actual: 142 grants, total of \$1,379,065; \$122,600 from Appropriation, \$1,256,465 from ACHF.

Community Arts Grants

Grants of up to \$5,000 for arts projects, using a county allocation block grant system and sub-divides Hennepin and Ramsey into "metro" and "greater metro" to ensure that project grants are accessible to groups outside of the core cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul. There were two rounds of Community Arts grants in FY 2016.

The arts are interwoven into every facet of community life. People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts. The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 grants budget: \$615,000; \$30,000 from General Fund Appropriation, \$585,000 from Arts & Cultural Heritage Fund.

Actual: 126 grants, total of \$615,624; \$30,000 from Appropriation, \$585,624 from ACHF.

• Arts Learning Grants

Grants up to \$10,000 for projects for people of all ages to develop knowledge, skills and understanding of the arts, and to increase learning through the arts.

The arts are interwoven into every facet of community life. People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts. The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 grants budget: \$430,000, all from Arts & Cultural Heritage Fund. Actual: 46 grants, total of \$432,388, all from ACHF.

Organizational Development and Capital Grants

Grants up to \$10,000 for projects that strengthen the management and/or infrastructure of nonprofit arts groups and for capital improvement. There was one round of Organizational Development & Capital grants in FY 2016.

The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 grants budget for Organizational Development and Capital: \$425,000, all from General Fund Appropriation.

Actual: 28 Organizational Development grants, 22 Capital grants for a total of \$450,010 all from Appropriation.

ADA Access Improvement Fund

A partnership with VSA Minnesota, for grants up to \$15,000 to arts organizations that own or are the principal tenants of buildings to make capital improvements to fully accommodate people with disabilities, or for arts organizations to increase their capacity to engage people with disabilities with their programming and services in significant and long-term ways.

The arts are interwoven into every facet of community life. People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts. The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total budget: \$195,000 all from Arts & Culture Heritage Fund.

Actual: One grant of \$195,000 to VSA from ACHF; VSA awarded 16 grants.

Management Consulting Fund; Management Training Fund; and Emergency Accessibility Fund

Small grants with monthly deadlines for "bite-size" projects to assist with focused organizational issues, increase access to professional development opportunities, and costs to enable groups to accommodate artists and audiences who have disabilities or access issues to a project or event on short notice.

People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts. The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 grants budget for the Management Consulting Fund, Management Training Fund, and Emergency Accessibility programs: \$70,000, all from Appropriation. Actual: 36 Management Consulting Fund grants (\$53,825); 64 Management Training Fund grants (\$10,521); and (0) Emergency Accessibility grants, total of \$64,346.

MRAC Arts Achievement Award

Recognition of two organizations--one in the "metro" (Minneapolis and St. Paul) and one in the "greater metro" (Anoka, Carver, Scott, Washington, Suburban Hennepin, Suburban Ramsey) areas of the region--that particularly exemplify artistic

excellence. These honorees were recognized for their outstanding accomplishments and artistic contributions at MRAC's annual meeting on July 26, 2016.

The arts are interwoven into every facet of community life.

People of all ages, ethnicities, and abilities participate in the arts.

The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 awards budget: \$10,000, all from the Appropriation. Actual: 2 awards of \$5,000 each, all from the Appropriation.

MRAC's 2016 Arts Achievement Award honorees were:

- Caponi Art Park, Eagan (greater metro)
- Ananya Dance Theatre, Minneapolis (metro)

Next Step Fund Grants

MRAC's only grant program for individual artists provided grants up to \$5,000 to professional artists in any discipline for the purpose of career development and artistic achievement. This program is a partnership funded by The McKnight Foundation. There was one round of Next Step Fund grants in FY 2016.

The arts thrive in Minnesota.

Total FY 2016 grants budget: \$182,000, all from McKnight Foundation. Actual grants: 37 grants, total of \$174,666.

TECHNICAL SERVICES SUPPORTING MRAC'S GRANT PROGRAMS

MRAC had planned to offer approximately 65 grant application workshops during 2016/17 biennium. These two-hour workshops cover the fundamentals of preparing an effective MRAC application prior to each grant round for major programs (Arts Activities Support, Community Arts, Arts Learning, Organizational Development, Capital, Next Step).

Actual grant application workshops during FY16: 30

Training and networking opportunities have been very successful tools in reaching and serving MRAC constituents groups, particularly "greater metro" groups that are isolated and unaware of resources available to help them. As groups participate in trainings and other convenings, they discover other connections for peer support and creative learning, resources and strategies and to bring the arts to their communities.

The arts thrive in Minnesota.

• LOCALS is a professional affinity group for art center/arts council managers in the 7 county metro area that meets several times a year and provides an opportunity to network, sharing promising practices, and learn together with guest speakers, on timely management topics. Due to MRAC's staff turnover in fall 2015, we were not able to offer programming with the LOCALS group. With

new staff hired in FY17, MRAC plans to re-connect with this group to coordinate programs and training activities.

Workshops & Trainings are free seminars for nonprofit arts organizations in the 7 county metro area with budgets under \$400,000 (although people from outside of the region and from larger organizations are welcome to attend). These activities provide training on topics that help small arts organizations improve the management of their organizations, such as social media, online fundraising and program evaluation among others.

MRAC has long standing relationships with MAP for Nonprofits, the Nonprofits Assistance Fund, Minnesota Council of Nonprofits, the University of St. Thomas, and Hamline University to help with identifying expert guest speakers.

Session topics are developed according to input from our constituents. Ten training workshops for nonprofit arts organizations were held from August 2015 - January 2016. In addition, MRAC co-sponsored a special convening with the Minnesota Council of Nonprofits in April 2016 on "Accessible Event Planning." In total, 314 people attended the 11 training sessions in FY16. However, due to MRAC staff turnover in fall 2015, the training program was put on hold for the remainder of the year until a new Program Director could be hired to coordinate this initiative. Attached at the end of this report is a MRAC FY16 Training Program Summary.

• MRAC's monthly e-newsletter provided stimulating and timely information for constituents and colleagues and three new Tri-Annual reports were produced that provided more in-depth stories about our constituents and the impact of their MRAC funded projects in our region.

Arts & Culture Funders Database

MRAC staff members are often asked, "Where else can I go for funding?" To help answer that question, MRAC continued a partnership during FY 2016 with Access Philanthropy, a Minneapolis-based consulting firm that helps nonprofits find and connect with funding resources. This searchable resource, the "Arts & Culture Funders Database" of approximately 448 funders, can be used by anyone for free through a link on MRAC's website or through Access Philanthropy's website at www.accessphilanthropy.com. In addition, users can register – also for free – to receive a quarterly calendar showing upcoming deadlines of ongoing and special funding opportunities, and MRAC will provide periodic alerts on updates to the Arts & Culture Funders Database.

Strategic Planning Update:

For the 2010/2011 and 2012/2013 biennia, MRAC had agreed as an organization that Legacy funds were too new to consider major changes in programs, and for the 2014/2015 biennium, the MRAC staff at that time agreed that the migration of grant

applications from paper to an online system was the dominant issue for MRAC that would render program changes impracticable.

Consequently, MRAC and board staff decided that the 2016/2017 biennium timeframe would provide an opportunity to take a deeper dive into our programs, policies, and procedures, some six years into Legacy funding that tripled our grants budget.

In early 2015, MRAC board and staff worked with Wilder Center for Communities to facilitate a series of conversations to identify critical issues with MRAC's board and staff that would lead up to MRAC's submission of a new biennial plan to MSAB. At the conclusion of these six listening sessions, it was decided that given the broad scope and diversity of issues that surfaced, MRAC would be benefit from undertaking a full-blown strategic planning process in FY16.

In addition, there was consensus that an important component of MRAC's biennial plan for 2016/2017 should be the development of an intentional diversity, equity, and inclusion lens for our work.

Organizational Transitions:

Due to several staff transitions in 2016, the proposed strategic planning process for FY16 was put on hold until new executive leadership was in place. Executive Director Jeff Prauer who had led MRAC for eight years, left in January 2016 and Shannon Forney, Program Director who managed the Organizational Development/Capital/Training programs left in November 2015. A board search committee was formed to lead the new executive director search process. Julie Sand was appointed Interim Executive Director during this transition. Amy Crawford was hired as the new Executive Director and began her position in June 2016. Ms. Crawford brings over thirty years of leadership experience and expertise from working in the philanthropic and nonprofit sectors.

Other staffing changes during FY16 included:

- *Bob Burns, Program Director at MRAC for 19 years managing the Arts Activities Support and Community Arts grant funds left his position on June 30, 2016.
- *Masami Kawazato, was hired to replace Bob Burns as the new Program Director, and began her position on June 1, 2016.
- *After a thorough review of the organization's staffing needs, it was determined that the Executive Director position would no longer manage the Arts Learning Program, as Prauer had since the program's inception. Kelly Affeldt, serving as part-time Program Associate at the time, was engaged to manage the second round of FY16 Arts Learning grants. Kelly will continue as Program Director of Arts Learning in a newly created 80% FTE position that also manages the Next Step Fund, with a start-date of June 1, 2016.

*To support the growth and development of MRAC's panelists involved in the grant review process, a new Community Engagement Coordinator position at 80% FTE was created in June with the goal of having a new staff on board in late summer. *The recruitment process was also started in May 2016 for a new Program Director position to manage the Organizational Development, Capital and monthly grant programs as well as to revitalize the training workshops with the goal of filling the position by July. This goal was successfully accomplished with the hiring of

ARTS and CULTURAL HERITAGE FUND PROGRAMS and SERVICES OUTCOMES

Bethany Whitehead as the new Program Director who started her position in mid-

MRAC's primary approach to the outcomes of our work aligns with the purposes of the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund, and the guidelines for all of our programs are designed to produce outcomes that will align with the ACHF purposes:

Arts & Arts Access

July 2016.

Support for Minnesota artists and arts organizations in creating, producing, and presenting high-quality arts activities; to overcome barriers to accessing high quality arts activities; and to instill the arts into the community and public life in this state.

Arts Education

For high quality, age-appropriate arts education for Minnesotans of all ages to develop knowledge, skills and understanding of the arts.

Arts and Cultural Heritage

For events and activities that represent the diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions, including folk and traditional artists and art organizations, represented in this state.

The goal in MRAC's 2016-17 Biennial Plan specific to Arts and Cultural Heritage Funds was for MRAC to continue to serve the artistic, cultural and geographic diversity of the metropolitan area through grants and services. The primary way that MRAC meets this goal is through grantmaking, which is summarized above. In addition, our Biennial Plan specified several Critical Success Factors towards achieving that goal:

- MRAC activity grants have a direct impact on constituents' ability to create successful arts projects that reach their target communities.
- MRAC's staff services, training programs and organizational grants help arts organizations strengthen and thrive.
- MRAC is accessible to its underrepresented communities in terms of relationship, funding, and services.
- MRAC staff is welcoming and informed.

We can report the following outcomes:

- *OUTCOME:* Many projects funded in FY 2016 are still in progress. Approximately, the majority of grant recipients' final reports that have been submitted to date indicate that the project was artistically successful, reached the target constituency, and had community impact. (We continue to strive to get grantees to report on <u>outcomes</u> rather than <u>outputs</u>, in part by simplifying our final report forms, and in part by clarifying what we mean by outcomes in our grant application workshops and other direct contact with applicants.)
- *OUTCOME:* While we did not send a constituent survey this year due to the staff transitions, we continue to receive positive feedback from our grant applicants and grantees for their involvement in MRAC's grant application workshops, ease and flexibility of online grant application process, access to our library and panel recordings, panel review process and technical assistance and support provided by MRAC staff. With a new staff team coming together for the FY17 program year, we plan to conduct a survey of applicants and grantees as part of our strategic planning process.
- *OUTCOME*: We continue to get applications from groups that have never applied before. The number of new applicants increased to <u>114</u> in FY16 from <u>95</u> in FY15. These new applicants represented a wide range of underrepresented and underserved populations including communities of color, New Americans groups, women, older adults, people with disabilities and GLBT individuals. At MRAC, "under-represented" is determined primarily in terms of geographic location, and obvious cultural specificity. Through our strategic planning efforts in FY17, we intend to further clarify the definition of this term as well as the meaning of "underserved."

ARTS ADVOCACY, EDUCATION, AND LEADERSHIP

Minnesotans believe the arts are vital to who we are.

Helping constituents better understand the power of grassroots advocacy is vital to MRAC's work. To achieve its arts advocacy goals, MRAC was actively involved in the work of the Forum of Regional Arts Councils of Minnesota, Minnesota Citizens for the Arts, the Minnesota State Arts Board and other organizations working to ensure that arts funding in Minnesota remains strong.

In previous years, MRAC's primary advocacy activity has been our "Big Check" events, at which groups receiving grants from the Arts Activities Support and Community Arts programs receive a poster-sized check, and the opportunity to be photographed with their state senators and representatives for publication in local newspapers. This event brings legislators and arts groups together, often for the first time, thereby educating arts groups in grassroots advocacy, and legislators on how small arts organizations are contributing to the vitality of their districts. Due to staffing changes this past year, we were not able to hold Big Check events as hoped, but did work closely with MCA in supporting Arts Advocacy Day 2016.

ORGANIZATION INFRASTRUCTURE

MRAC is governed by a board of directors, which has a 21-member maximum. The current membership includes 18 people from all seven counties, and a broad mix of backgrounds and skills, including arts organization administrators, community education and parks/recreation directors, individual artists, and for-profit sector professionals. All current board members have served on MRAC grant review panels.

From July 1, 2015 - January 30, 2016, Jeff Prauer served as MRAC's executive director. Julie Sand was appointed by MRAC's board to serve as Interim Executive Director from January-June 2016. Amy Crawford was selected to lead MRAC as its new Executive Director and began her position in June 2016.

The MRAC Board Nominating Committee began meeting in March to consider candidates for board vacancies and to draft a slate of officers for FY 2017, which was presented to and approved by the board at its June 28, 2016 meeting: Peter Leggett, president; Shelly Chamberlain, vice president; Julie Andersen secretary; Dayna Martinez, treasurer; and Colleen McLaughlin, member-at-large.

Jill Anfang, Assistant Director; City of Roseville Parks & Recreation Department was recognized for her six years of board service.

Two new members were elected to MRAC's board of directors for a three year term: Djenane Saint Juste, Founder and Executive Director of the Afoutayi Haitian Dance Company, and Osman M. Ali, Founder and Executive Director of the Somali Museum of Minnesota respectively, at its board meeting held on June 28, 2016.

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

As referenced in the Planning Process section on page 6, the increasing diversity in all seven counties over the past several years, and the fact that the current staff of 6.5 FTE during FY16 has two persons of color, have prompted MRAC to develop some intentional actions that will result in:

- A common understanding throughout the organization of what diversity, inclusion and underserved mean,
- How to assess and improve the organization's inclusiveness, and
- How to assess and increase racial equity with applicants, grantees and panelists.

In February, the Board of Directors created an Inclusion & Representation Task Force to serve, update and refine MRAC's diversity, equity and inclusion goals that were identified in the Fiscal Year 2016 and 2017 Biennial Plan. While inclusion and equity will never be considered "completed" actions, we do anticipate that there will be outcomes that can inform and improve MRAC's work. During FY 17, MRAC will identify indicators of diversity, equity, and inclusion according to various categories, which may be include for example: racial-ethnic-cultural; types of art; gender; and geography, etc. These indicators will become metrics to which the organization will hold itself accountable.

FINANCIAL REPORT

We anticipate that the FY 2016 audit will be reviewed and approved by the MRAC Board of Directors at its meeting on October 25, 2016.
