Proclamation

WHEREAS: Caries, the process that leads to cavities, has become a silent epidemic in this country;

and

WHEREAS: Caries is the most common chronic disease of childhood, five times more common than

childhood asthma, seven times more common than childhood hay fever, and 20 times

more common than childhood diabetes; and

WHEREAS: Caries is a preventable infectious process; and

WHEREAS: Fluoride has been found to prevent or reduce the caries process and can be found in

public water and toothpaste. Fluoride varnish can be applied to teeth on a quarterly

basis, starting when the first tooth erupts, or by age one at the latest; and

WHEREAS: Primary care medical providers can provide caries prevention services that include

caregiver education and fluoride varnish application as part of well-child examinations

or at a visit for episodic (illness) care; and

WHEREAS: Children's oral health can be improved through stronger collaborative efforts between

primary care medical providers and dental providers by ensuring caries prevention services are provided as part of well/ill child care visits, and referrals to dental providers

for restorative care can be accepted every time; and

WHEREAS: Community service organization members equipped with the appropriate education can

leverage their knowledge about the needs of their communities and become vocal advocates, educating community members about the caries crisis and how it can be

prevented.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, February 29, 2016, as:

CRUSH CHILDHOOD CAVITY DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
