WHEREAS: The nature of federal and state legislation necessitates that county, tribal, and state health and human services workers continually expand their knowledge, skills, and expertise related to their professions and the needs of the communities they serve; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota recognizes the valuable public service county, tribal, and state health and human services workers perform each and every day for the health, prevention, and protection of the Minnesotans.
