Proclamation

WHEREAS: Agriculture is the backbone of Minnesota. 80,000 farms, comprised of 27 million acres of farm land, make up more than one-half of the state's land area; and

WHEREAS: The American farmer, a national symbol of strength and character, has displayed ingenuity in times of prosperity and perseverance in the face of hardships, while consistently supplying our state, nation, and world with an abundance of high-quality agricultural goods and products; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's farm families are stewards of the land, contributing to the health, beauty, productivity, and quality of our state's natural resources for the benefit of all Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Department of Agriculture's mission is to enhance the quality of life for all Minnesotans, by ensuring the integrity of our food supply, the health of our environment, and the strength of our agricultural economy; and

WHEREAS: Agriculture is essential to the state's health, recreation, and economy, generating more than \$18.5 billion in farm income and more than \$6 billion in agricultural exports annually; and

WHEREAS: 2013 marks the 40th anniversary of National Agriculture Week, an effort to raise awareness of the crucial role of agriculture in providing the food and fiber necessary for everyday life.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of March 17 – 23, 2013 as:

AGRICULTURE WEEK

in the State of Minnesota.
