- WHEREAS: Community action agencies were created when the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 was signed into law and are celebrating a 49-year history of promoting self-sufficiency for those with limited incomes; and
- WHEREAS: Community action agencies have made essential contributions to individuals and families in Minnesota by providing them with innovative and cost-effective programs; and
- WHEREAS: Community action agencies are needed as major participants in the reform of the welfare system as we know it; and
- WHEREAS: Welfare reform in Minnesota has benefited from the State's partnership with community action agencies; and
- WHEREAS: Those living on limited incomes continue to need opportunities to improve their lives and their living conditions; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota and the United States must continue to wage war on poverty by providing support and opportunity for all citizens in need of assistance, thus ensuring that all citizens are able to live with dignity.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May 2013 as:
