Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Domestic violence is defined as a perpetrator's systematic use of economic, emotional, psychological, sexual, and/or physical tactics to degrade and dominate their intimate partner; and
- WHEREAS: Domestic violence affects all Minnesotans, occurring in all racial, social, religious, ethnic, geographic, and economic groups; and
- WHEREAS: The perpetrators of domestic violence not only violate the human rights of their victims, they also endanger children, traumatize families, and undermine the economic stability, safety, and wellbeing of our communities; and
- WHEREAS: Survivors of domestic violence have bravely confronted its legacy by leading multidisciplinary coalitions of advocates and families to support victims and educate communities. The Minnesota Department of Public Safety Office of Justice Programs reports that in 2011, more than 63,800 primary victims received services from battered women's shelters, domestic abuse agencies, and the eighty-four programs that comprise the Minnesota Coalition for Battered Women; and
- WHEREAS: The dangers presented by domestic violence have been tragically illustrated by at least thirty-four domestic violence homicides in Minnesota in 2011; and
- WHEREAS: Domestic Violence Awareness Month is an opportunity to underscore the commitments made by organizations to end violence at home.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of October, 2012 as:

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH

in the State of Minnesota.
