Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Providing emergency medical services is a vital public service; and
- WHEREAS: The lead agency for emergency medical services in Minnesota is the Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board; and
- WHEREAS: Access to quality emergency care dramatically improves the survival and recovery rates of those who experience sudden illness or injury; and
- WHEREAS: Injury prevention and the appropriate use of the emergency medical services system will help reduce health care costs; and
- WHEREAS: Members of emergency medical services teams—many of them volunteers—are ready to provide lifesaving care to those in need 24 hours a day, seven days a week; and
- WHEREAS: Emergency medical services teams in Minnesota consist of emergency physicians and nurses, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, firefighters, law enforcement personnel, medical dispatchers, educators, and administrators, and others.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 20-26, 2012 as:

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK

in the State of Minnesota.
