Proclamation

- WHEREAS: From the 1970s to the 1990s, Black fashion shows and performance art were an important part of cultural life in the State of Minnesota; and
- WHEREAS: Black fashion professionals and enthusiasts enriched the artistic community with unique patterns, vivid coloring, and innovative design; and
- WHEREAS: Participants gave freely of their time, talents, and services to help create opportunities for African-American artists, provide exposure for the fashion community, and entertain audiences and fashion enthusiasts; and
- WHEREAS: Black fashion shows and events were held across the Twin Cities region at various venues, including restaurants, nightclubs, theatres, churches, hotels, and community centers; and
- WHEREAS: On October 21, 2012, a special celebration at the Capri Theatre in Minneapolis, Minnesota, will reunite models, designers, producers, commentators, photographers, and fashion enthusiasts to commemorate the influence of Black fashion on Minnesota's cultural history.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 21, 2012 as:

BLACK FASHION HISTORY DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
