The State Canvassing Board, consisting of Hon. Julius A. Schmahl, Secretary of State, Hon. Calvin L. Brown and Hon. P. E. Brown, Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, Hon. Wilbur F. Booth, Judge of the Fourth Judicial District, and Hon. J. H. Quinn, Judge of the Seventeenth Judicial District, to whom was referred the return of votes cast in the several cities and towns in the manner prescribed by law at the primary election held September 17, A. D. 1912, for United States Senator, Representative in Congress at Large, State Officers, Representatives in Congress from the several Congressional districts, Representatives to the State Legislature from districts which comprise more than one county, and for Justices of the Supreme Court and Judges of the District Courts, report as follows:
