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What The NWRDC is All About . . .

Regional Development Commissions were created by the State Legislature through the Regional Development Act of 1969. The intent of the Act was to create an option for rural units of government to supplement existing public services and coordinate specific activities of mutual concern. Although created by the State, Regional Development Commissions were left in the hands of local representatives to insure that the final design would reflect area needs and preferences.

The Northwest Regional Development Commission was created on February 2, 1973 by the joint actions of local units of government. Programs were set up to reflect priority work items



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of the time; and relationships were established with the state and federal agencies that could provide assistance with local projects. Programs and work priorities have changed in response to economic and social trends; but the central mission of supporting efforts by cities, counties, townships, businesses and individuals to improve living, working and natural resource conditions in Northwest Minnesota has remained the same.

The Commission has worked to establish a manner of operation which reflects and compliments the independent, progressive style of Northwest Minnesota. Technical assistance, specialized program delivery, public participation, direct funding, access to information and formalized planning services are the basic materials which we can contribute to the construction of your project.



## Aging

AREA AGENCY ON AGING

**Purpose:** To build a proactive, comprehensive and coordinated system of advocacy and services that ensures the rights and benefits of all older people.

**Program Funding Sources:** Older Americans Act through the Minnesota Board on Aging - \$134,838; RDC Tax Levy - \$47,816; Miscellaneous - \$6,391.

Regrant Funding Sources: Older Americans Act - \$303,797; U.S. Department of Agriculture Nutrition Program - \$94,896; State Nutrition Program - \$106,832.

Service Priorities: Regrant priorities are: nutrition, congregate and home delivered meals, legal service, transportation, chore/home repair, housekeeping, visiting and medical forms assistance. Support priorities are advocacy, education, support of county committees on aging and senior centers, inter-agency linkages, and information/referral.

### Aging Highlights

Dining Manager Training • • •

Conducted "Discovering Diversity" training for staff of the Nutrition Program. A self assessment helped 30 dining managers and regional staff discover attitudes about differences in the work place. This training will be used to encourage new people to participate at the nutrition sites.

Migrant Health Services · · ·

Staff contacted care coordinator from Migrant Health Services to discuss the AAA and other programs. During the enrollment of migrant families, questions will be asked regarding age of family members and intent to remain in Minnesota year round. This will help us identify minority seniors for outreach efforts.

Minority Student Services Coordinator • • •

Provided information about the AAA and services funded to the Minority Student Services Coordinator at Thief River Falls School District. Encouraged him to share information with family members to facilitate accessing services by minority seniors.

Hallock Community/Senior Center · · ·

Staff assisted with the preparation of a grant budget to purchase equipment for the senior center. MBA provided technical assistance regarding the process of approval needed for the senior center grant. We participated as a member of the Hallock Community Senior Citizen Center Task Force, assisting in generating ideas for fund raising and possible staffing of the senior center.



Lifetime of Learning • • •

We assisted the RSVP and Mn Extension Service with the development of a new program, which will provide seniors an opportunity to volunteer in the delivery of educational programs to communities.

Respite Strategic Planning • • •

We shared ideas with staff from Lutheran Social Services and discussed ways Respite Services could be expanded to become a regional program. Potential Partnership arrangements with Living At Home/Block Nurse Programs in Marshall County were discussed.

Fall Conference on Aging • • •

Over 350 seniors and service providers attended the 2000 Fall Conference on Aging, held at the University of Minnesota, Crookston. This conference continues to attract seniors from all seven counties in our region, as well as people from North Dakota and other counties in Minnesota.

Dual Eligibles Outreach · · ·

In conjunction with Department of Human Services, Polk and Pennington counties, we implemented an outreach program to identify people eligible for the Medicare Savings Programs.

Long Term Care Task Force • • •

We participated in meetings convened by the Long Term Care Task Force. This Task Force was made of 12 bipartisan legislators and three commissioners from the Departments of Health, Human Services, and Housing. The goal of the Task Force was to develop a common understanding of the needs and issues in long term care and to recommend proposals for the 2001 Legislative Session.

Senior Linkage Information and Assistance • • •

The Area Agency on Aging assisted 1,361 individuals who called on the Senior LinkAge Line. Staff provided information on services that are available in assisting seniors to remain independent. A total of 3,296 additional contacts were made.

## Aging Continued

**Purpose:** The Health Insurance Counseling Program offers older adults, Medicare beneficiaries and their family members assistance in obtaining appropriate health care coverage and entitled Medicare/Medicaid or insurance benefits.

**Service Priorities:** Specially trained volunteer health insurance counselors are available to assist all seniors, free of charge with information and assistance on a confidential, one-to-one basis. The program also serves to educate the public about the health care reimbursement systems and increase awareness of the program to seniors and family members.

### Health Insurance Counseling Highlights

### Information Provided · · ·

Provided information and assistance to 705 persons. Of the 705 calls received, 1,306 contacts have been made. The Senior Linkage line continues to be the central access for all Health Insurance Counseling calls.

### Volunteer/Direct Assistance · · ·

Volunteers provided assistance to 136 individuals for a total of 207.5 hours. A total of \$180,962.48 was recovered/ saved for Medicare Beneficiaries.

### Recovery of Entitled Benefits . . .

Helped assist a client with a Medicare appeal. Medicare reviewed and reversed the decision and paid \$1,700. Assisted another client who has a \$2,299 balance forward on a bill from 2000. The claim had not been filed to Medicare. The claim was filed and the bill was paid by the insurances.

### Recruitment Collaboration • • •

Program continues to collaborate with existing volunteer programs such as Retired Senior Volunteer Program, Region 2, Region 5, and the Ombudsman program to recruit new volunteers.

### Volunteer Information Training • • •

Provided Health Insurance Counseling volunteer training to Region 2 and Region 5 volunteers. Continuing collaboration with Region 2 and Region 5 to provide training for new volunteers and quarterly updates to staff and volunteers.

### Volunteer Policies/Procedures · · ·

Trained Region 2 on Program Policy/Procedures, Client Intake, and related forms and volunteer training information. Policies and Procedures will be revised to reflect the origin of services for clients in the Region 2 service area.

### Educational Outreach Activities • • •

Staff conducted informational presentations to seniors, family members, health care providers and agencies that provide assistance to seniors. Information includes, but is not limited to, Medicare Fraud and Abuse, Medicare Education and Awareness, Prescription Drug Program and Long Term Care Insurance.

### Health Care Access Project · · ·

The North Region Health Alliance is interested in partnering with the AAA and Health Insurance Counseling Program to implement a Health Care Access Program. This program will identify individuals who have no insurance and assist them with accessing health insurance coverage. We will use the Senior Linkage Line to access information and assistance on programs available.

### Outreach Activities · · ·

The Commission continues to provide information on available programs to agencies that serve seniors, people with disabilities, and minority populations through the local media, newsletters, senior fairs and community calendars.

### Senior Surf Days · · ·

Staff collaborated with RSVP to utilize their volunteers to present Senior Surf Days to medicare beneficiaries, caregivers, and volunteers. They offered basic education on computers, HCFA health care resources and other caregiver resources available on the internet.

### Dual Eligible Outreach Project • • •

Region 1 AAA/HIC program, one of three in the state, was chosen by DHS to participate in an outreach grant project for dual eligible senior citizens living in Minnesota. The program provides seniors who have low incomes with information, application assistance, enrollment in Medicare's Dual Eligible programs (QMB/SLMB), and the Prescription Drug Program (PDP).

### NORTHWEST REGIONAL ARTS COUNCIL

Purpose: To promote, develop and encourage artistic growth and excellence of arts organizations and individual artists in northwestern Minnesota by awarding funds and conducting programs and services.

Program Funding Sources: MN State Arts Board -\$62,902 and Interest - \$2,683; McKnight Foundation - \$4,349; RDC Tax Levy - \$1,466; Miscellaneous -\$1,985.

Re-Grant Funding Sources: MN State Arts Board -\$71,851; McKnight Foundation - \$17,345.

Re-Grant Programs: State Funds: Production Assistance/Sponsorship; Artist in the Schools; Public Art Projects. McKnight Funds: Individual and Student Artist Grants; Small Capital; Training & Development.

Service Priorities: Direction setting, grants to organizations, grants to individual and student artists, information including newsletter, training/workshops.

### Arts Highlights

Production Assistance/Sponsorship · · ·

In fiscal year 2001, we re-granted \$46,065 to 15 different productions and 15 sponsorship projects throughout the region. Eleven of the projects were specifically aimed at children. An estimated 23,270 adults attended and over 8,380 youth participated.

Artists in the Schools Grant Program • • •

In the second year of this program, \$20,800 was regranted to area schools. This program was so popular that after the first deadline 3/4ths of the funds allocated were awarded. With the allocation of more funds, 17 projects were awarded serving 7,130 students.

### Public Arts • • •

Although only one \$5,500 award was made this year, the public art program continued to generate interest with four installations and many meetings to discuss new project ideas. Openings occurred in Red Lake Falls, Fosston, Crookston, and East Grand Forks.

### Small Capital Grants • • •

\$5,160 was granted to arts organizations to purchase mainly light and sound equipment. Four organizations received awards. Three organizations are alternates for funding with \$4,175 of requests pending.

### McKnight Artist Grants . . .

Seven adult artists and six student artists received awards this year. In the individual Artist category \$5,195 was granted. In the Student Artist category \$2,950 was granted. Most awards were for training in new 8 techniques or skills related to their art form.

MCK Training & Development Grants • • •

Three awards totaling \$2,250 were awarded to area arts organizations. This is the last year of this program.

Northwest Minnesota Art Exhibition • • •

Planned and implemented the exhibit on April 21-22, 2001, at Northland Community Technical College, in Thief River Falls. Worked with the Council and the cosponsor to coordinate the jury process, registration, hanging, greeting, artist reception, and check-out.

### Needs Assessment • • •

Conducted our needs assessment including two surveys and four needs forum meetings. The planning committee evaluated the needs assessment results and completed the biennial plan for the Minnesota State Arts Board. Needs assessments are required every four years.

Web Site Development-Arts • • •

Updated and created web pages for the arts that include our grant forms, a grant application request form, and more information on our arts organizations and artists.

Minnesota State Arts Board Outreach • • •

Two Minnesota State Arts Board staff members held a training workshop on their grant programs - Education and Individual Artist. Our office helped coordinate the meeting and present our grant programs to the six people attending.

Governor's Conference on Tourism ...

Attended this conference in Bloomington in January 2001. Theme was Arts/Culture in tourism.

Functional Art Exhibit • • •

Helped plan the Functional Art Exhibit which was displayed in Fosston in August and September, 2000. The Forum of Regional Arts Councils was the sponsor of this exhibit.

## Economic Development

**Purpose:** To assist in creation of new jobs by providing general planning guidance, technical assistance for specific industrial projects and services to local units of government.

Program Funding Sources: United States Economic Development Administration (EDA) - \$53,584; RDC Tax Levy - \$18,624.

Service Priorities: Regional Economic Analysis and Planning, Local Planning, Technical Assistance to Local Development Groups, Grant Writing, Business Counseling and Referral, Information on other Development Programs and Resources, Data and Statistics, and Tourism.

### Economic Development Highlights

### Wireless Broadband . . .

Euclid, Angus, Tabor, Argyle, West Argyle, East Warren, Alvarado, Oslo, Lancaster, Lake Bronson, Florian, St. Vincent, Strandquist, and East Grand Forks will have wireless broadband access points. This was made possible through the cooperation of Rural Access, Halstad Telecommunications Company, Marshall and Polk Counties, the University of Minnesota, Crookston, and the Department of Trade and Economic Development Catalyst grants totaling \$50,900.

### CEDS · · ·

Completed the 2000 update of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS), including obtaining County Board approvals. Population, age, employment, income, retail, manufacturing and agriculture sales plus labor force trends are shown.

County Economic Profiles • • •

Completed county economic profiles like the CEDS, but specific to each county, and examined the need for county economic development strategies.

### River Basin Planning • • •

Completed recommendations on how Northwest Minnesota counties can most effectively and efficiently participate in the Red River Basin natural resource planning.

Labor, Manufacturers, Students Survey . . .

Local economic developers, NWRDC, Headwaters Regional Development Commission, Northwest Minnesota Foundation, and others worked together to obtain \$150,000 to complete a detailed study of labor supply and demand in Regions One and Two.

### Economic Developers Group • • •

The Northwest Economic Developers Group met bimonthly throughout the year with support from the NWRDC. Information sharing and featured speakers on new topics, such as the new Small Business Development Center in Bemidji, were provided. One or more community members are invited, along with economic development professionals.

Collin Peterson's Telecommunications Mtg. • • • Featured speaker about our local efforts in high-speed, 2-way wireless, internet projects and the income/education digital divide at Congressman Peterson's Telecommunications Meeting in Wadena.

### Lenders Forum • • •

Featured speaker about how lenders could help Farm Wrap at the University of Minnesota Extension's Lenders Forum in Thief River Falls.

#### Innovations · · ·

Provided technical assistance to entrepreneurs, and individual businesses who need to start up, restructure, or move past the start up stage into real business plans. Projects included a vegetarian foods processor, an animal agriculture theme park, a custom embroidery business, a shipping carton manufacturer, a wellness center, a federally inspected meat plant, dried technologies, compost spreading, and others totaling 26 entrepreneurs. Set up meetings where beginning, expanding, e-commerce-interested businesses can learn from each other and learn about available programs and funding sources. Bringing "Access Minnesota Mainstreet" web site development classes to the area was the result.

### Economic Development Continued

Computer Loaner Project · · ·

Assisted with writing grants for Crookston Community Education and Crookston High School to implement a lending library of wireless computers for students to teach parents, and grandparents computer skills while developing a job resume together.

Technology Catalyst Grant-Euclid • • •

Created an application for wireless broadband equipment for test sites in and around the Euclid area. Criteria will be based on need, job creation, and business or farm growth. This DTED grant was to Polk County for regrants in the Euclid Area. Halstad Telco will provide the equipment for the grants.

Wind Industry · · ·

Held an informational session on wind energy, April 5. Interest was strong in the 1 to 5 wind turbine size which in our area is appropriate. These small plants could power schools, and entire communities.



HOUSING PROGRAM

Purpose: To increase the housing stock in the region.
Program Funding Sources: NW MN Foundation - \$22,500; RDC Tax Levy - \$982.

Service Priorities: Assisting communities, lenders, consumers, and agencies to access available programs that repair, rehab and build affordable homes.


### Housing Highlights

We supported and participated in ROHDA which consists of the NWRDC, Tri-Valley Opportunity Council, Northwest Community Action Agency, Inter-County Community Council and Multi-County Housing Authority. We completed an application to the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) for funding to complete a variety of housing construction and rehabilitation projects in the Region. The application was funded for \$1,000,000. Funding was for more down payment assistance in Kittson County, new construction financing for new Institution Community Work Crews homes, and emergency housing repair grants for rural homes.

Emergency repair grants cover a gap in housing programs in that they can help rural homeowners with wells and septic tank systems, decaying windows, and other emergency type repairs not covered in existing programs. Farm Wrap™ will help collect rural applications.

Energy Task Force · · ·

Exploring more options for energy production. Wind, Methane Digestion and biomass are possibilities.



Compost Pilot Project · · ·

NWRDC worked with the University of Minnesota, Extension, Minnesota Pollution Control, Board of Water and Soil Resources, Pembina RC&D, AURI, and local producers to establish sites for the business of mobile composting using EnviroGro Solutions' Bio-Digester<sup>TM</sup> from Prior Lake, Minnesota. Manure, dead animal and beet pulp composting results will be measured.

Over the last two years, down-payment assistance loan pools helped over 140 new homebuyers afford their first home.

We prepared the pre-proposal and the full proposal to the NWMF for support for ROHDA to implement the region-wide, multi-faceted new construction, rehab plan. \$30,000 was approved.

We expanded the number of affordable home plans available to the work crews, and applied for a regional MURL (Buy,Fix,Sell on contract for deed) application to MHFA as well. Although, moving Marshall County Flood Buyout homes did not work out, innovative projects are in the works, such as rehabilitating vacant small town business buildings into affordable housing.

Community Visits • • •

We went out to 12 communities in the region to see what the needs are, and especially the housing need. By combining housing programs with homes built with Institution Community Work Crews (ICWC), special Sentence to Serve crews, and community donated lots and services, it is possible to build a 3 bedroom, no basement, affordable home. Some communities will need to develop mobile home parks with covenants on the land, in order to have attractive, very low-cost housing available for young families. Strategic planning, marketing planning, growing existing businesses, water and sewer for new lots, and web site development were other key issues facing the small town. Visiting all 56 communities in our seven county region is our goal.

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## Enterprise Fund

**Purpose:** To strengthen and diversify the economy by providing a source of low interest financing to businesses when credit is not otherwise available from other sources to ensure the successful completion of activities to be financed.

**Program Funding Sources:** Loan Interest and Loan Fees - \$65,073.

**Loan Funding Sources:** Loan Repayments and Loan Interest - \$476,496, Economic Development Administration - \$18,074, NWRDC Tax Levy - \$1,378.

**Service Priorities:** Financing for-profit businesses which create or retain jobs, especially for the long term underemployed or unemployed.

To date, one hundred eight business loans have been approved for financing for a total amount of \$6,725,777. The program has assisted forty-two new businesses, thirty-nine businesses with expansions, and twenty-seven businesses with retention. Forty-eight of the loans are currently active, forty-three are fully repaid, eleven loans have been written off, and closing is pending on six approved loans.

In fiscal year 2001, approval was obtained from the Economic Development Administration to combine the 1997 flood Disaster Relief Loan Fund with the standard Revolving Loan Fund. In addition to supporting new and expanding businesses, the loan funds may also be used to assist formerly healthy businesses with financing for working capital and other needs so they can survive the economic stresses brought on by weather-related and other disasters.

The Enterprise Fund's administration budget for the year is \$65,073. The loan fees collected and one-half of the interest earned on the loans and on accounts are used for administrative costs. The other one-half of the interest payments, along with the principal repaid on loans, becomes available for relending.

## Farm Recovery

### FARM RECOVERY PROGRAM

**Purpose:** To continue the farm recovery efforts in northwest Minnesota through a coordinated range of services designed to assist the farm family in a holistic manner

Program Funding Sources: Economic Development Administration (EDA) - \$28,793; Tax Levy - \$19,672.

Regrant Funding Sources: MN State Legislature - \$550,000; Otto Bremer Foundation - \$52,598.

Service Priorities: Grant program for financial, tax implication, and legal counseling concerning exit or restructuring strategies for the farm family and individual assistance.

### Farm Recovery Highlights

### Farm Wrap™ Technical Assistance Grants · · ·

Farm Wrap™ took on a permanent feeling with the hiring of a former farmer from Warren, Cameron Fanfulik, and funding from the State Legislature. Farmers can choose from two grants designed to help them at an important juncture in their lives. Ag-CPA and Ag-Attorney consultation grants aid the decision-making process of restructuring or exit strategies. Grants are made through team recommendations.

### Farm Wrap™ Coverage · · ·

Over 80 families were served through the financial and legal grant program in Kittson, Marshall, Roseau, Pennington, Polk, Red Lake, Norman, Mahnomen, Clearwater, and Beltrami Counties.

### Farm Wrap™ Coordination · · ·

Supplied the overall coordination of the "group of groups," the informal network of service providers for the farmer.

### Farm Wrap™ Case Conferences · · ·


Coordinated the team meetings needed to solve the more difficult problem situations.

### Farm Resumes · · ·

Helped families develop their skills resume as they transition to other employment. The varied skills, abilities, and solid work ethic listed in these resumes make our farmers attractive to regional employers.

### Individual Assistance · · ·

Helped to provide information and solutions to Farm Wrap members concerning credit card informal mediation, job search, educational opportunities, options for the disabled, help with computer operation, questions on farm mortgages, and exploring new technologies.



### Phone Outreach · · ·

Phoned past participants in Farm Wrap<sup>™</sup> to find out employment problems, education, housing, and health insurance needs.

### Statistics · · ·

Keep statistics for decreases in property value, acreage farmed, farm losses, business loss, loss of income and research for various value-added options.

### The Rural Help Network • • •

Worked with our partner program to fill service gaps in Clay, Becker, Wilkin, Otter Tail, Traverse, Grant, Douglas, Stevens, and Pope Counties.

### Individual Meetings with Legislators · · ·

Met with our Legislators and 22 other farm district Legislators at the State Capitol regarding Farm Wrap™ and other key economic issues.

### Contracted Services · · ·

Served as the fiscal agent for re-granting funds to Rural Life Outreach, Lakeland Mental Health Center, NW Mental Health Center, U of M -Crookston, and MN Extension Services to assist farmers with issues related to the farm crisis. Outreach, emergency funds, mental health services, and informal mediation services were provided to over 2,000 farm families in a 23 county area.

Helped nine county historical groups work together to complete joint projects including the Historical Tourism Seminar and the formatting/mailing of their newsletter.



### Mapping • • •

Used NWRDC Geographical Information Systems to assist with local mapping efforts including: Marshall County Flood plain and 300 foot buffer strip map, Warren-Alvarado EMT Map, planning for MN Regional Cooperative Emergency Medical Services, GIS Training in Roseau County, fiber optic maps for locating empty service areas, and maps for placing wind generated power stations.

### Regional Economic Profile · · ·

Updated the regional economic summary with the 2000 Census data and the latest economic statistics to help focus local and regional development efforts.

### Housing Construction Funds • • •

Worked with the Region One Housing Development Alliance to secure \$1,000,000 in state funds and \$85,000 in local funds for housing construction.

### Institutional Community Work Crews • • •

Developed a partnership with Tri-Valley and Inter-County to share operation of ICWC Crews and use inmate labor to build 12 affordable homes each year with a \$70,000 maximum price.

### Business Outreach · · ·

Completed visits to 22 area businesses to determine what assistance would increase their capacity to maintain and expand employment opportunities.

### Legislative Advocacy • • •

Participated in Minnesota Association of Regional Development Organization's successful effort to obtain \$500,000 for local planning assistance.

## Special Projects

A variety of sources provided funding for special projects which supplemented services in our regular programs. We wish to thank each of these organizations for the opportunity to do more for Northwest Minnesota over the past year. The following is a summary of each project:

### **LABOR MARKET SURVEY**

Funding Sources: MN Legislature/MN Department of Trade and Economic Security, NW MN Foundation, local match.

A large number of agencies, development groups, and businesses formed a study group to complete an extensive analysis of the availability of labor and the labor needs of businesses. This information will be used to attract and encourage job growth in labor surplus areas or to help business address labor/skill shortages.

### NORTHERN COUNTIES LAND USE PLANNING

Funding Sources: MN Legislature/MN Planning and local match.

We finished the administration of a grant to the Northern Counties Land Use Coordinating Board for the completion of draft land use plans in 10 northern Minnesota counties. NW Minnesota participants included Marshall and Pennington counties.

### MHFA HOUSING FUNDS

Funding Sources: Minnesota Housing Finance Agency and local match.

We started administration of a one million dollar grant for housing construction, home repairs, and home purchases. Funds will be re-granted to Inter County Community Council, Multi-County HRA, Northwest Community Action Agency, and Tri-Valley Opportunity Council.



### **RED CROSS FLOOD RECOVERY**

Funding Source: Red Cross

The last of our flood recovery funds were used to complete home repairs.

### ANIMAL WASTE COMPOSTING

Funding Sources: Federal Economic Development Administration, NW MN Foundation, local match.

Work continued on the organization of a pilot project for high tech composting of animal waste and other agricultural by-products. This is part of an effort to encourage the continuation of animal based farming and value-added processing.

### HOUSING CONSTRUCTION START-UP

Funding Sources: NW MN Foundation and local match.

The Foundation provided funding to support the development of a public sector housing development effort. This project will enable local housing organizations to secure financing, strengthen ties to local communities, establish construction methods, and create floor plans for the construction of eight affordable homes each year. Target selling prices are from \$50,000 to \$70,000.

### HOUSING COALITION

Funding Sources: NW Minnesota Foundation

A coalition of housing agencies from Regions 1 and 2 completed a three year process to increase the capacity of our area to get residents into affordable housing options. This effort created the base for on-going programs including downpayment assistance, interim construction financing, homeowner education, senior housing options, public housing developers, and emergency rural housing repairs.

## Transportation

**Purpose:** To insure safe efficient movement of people and commodities in the region. Provide an ongoing forum for important transportation issues in the region. Assist MN/DOT and provide input with it's planning efforts and programs.

Funding Sources: MN Department of Transportation - \$50,000; and RDC Tax Levy - \$12,602.

**Service Priorities:** Direction setting, comprehensive regional planning, legislative advocacy, MN/DOT project coordination.

### Transportation Highlights


Development of Local Trails • • •

Staff continued to meet with the Northstar ATV Club and the DNR to develop multi-use trails. We are incorporating local ATV trail designs into the Mn/DNR's proposal for an Off Highway Vehicle system plan for Northwest Minnesota.

Assisted Senator's Office with Trails Maps • • •

Developed maps for Senator Stumpfs' office illustrating a trail system for ATV recreation. The map contains existing trails along with Con-Con lands that can be used for recreation in Marshall, Beltrami, and Roseau Counties. The maps were used during discussions for designations of ConCon lands. The legislative representatives have been invited on a trail tour in the Grygla to Fourtown area this October.

### Regional Planning . . .

Formulated Region One transportation goals and priorities for incorporation into the district ATP plan. Coordinated an interregional 10-Ton corridor coalition to study a North-South route connecting Roseau to USTH 2.

### County Board Meetings • • •

Staff visited each county board to discuss transportation issues occurring within each county and throughout the region. We discussed the proposed 10-ton corridor linking Roseau County to USTH 2 along with planning a Super 2 design of USTH 59. Discussion also focused on transportation funding for the different allotments of federal money.

### Scenic Byway • • •

The Minnesota Office of Tourism held a group session for planning, development, and promotion tactics for the Waters of The Dancing Sky Scenic Byway. Gathered historical information along this corridor for incorporation into a scenic byway planning document. Discussed plans to extend to the scenic byway through Kittson County to Interstate 29.

### Red River Bridge Study • • •

The bridge sub-committee identified the first steps in addressing the long term issue of replacing and maintaining bridges over the Red River. The committee is also developing a data base of information containing road closure frequency, length of road closure, and detour distances.

### 10-Ton North-South Corridor • • •

Staff attended the Washington D.C. Transportation Alliance Fly-In to discuss the needs for a 10-ton corridor linking Northwestern Minnesota to USTH 2. We will continue working with Congressman Peterson's office to obtain federal funding for this route.

### Plan a Super 2 Design for USTH 59 • • •

Studying the possibility of a Super 2 design on USTH 59 between Fergus Falls and Thief River Falls. Two Mn/DOT districts and three RDC's are currently studying the needs for this corridor.

### Transportation Webpage · · ·

The Commission placed county highway construction maps onto the NWRDC Webpage for public knowledge of construction sites and possible road closures in each county. Reviewed the maps with each county board.

**Area Plan on Aging -** The Area Plan on Aging examines senior input and demographic data to establish priorities for the use of Title III Older Americans Act funds. Includes budget information, an Executive Summary and work activities.

FY 2001 Work Program - Details the goals and objectives of the Commission in each of the program and planning areas.

2000 Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) - This document examines economic, social, and physical information about the seven counties in Northwest Minnesota and makes recommedations on activites to enhance and improve the economy. The recommendations concentrate on job creation, agriculture, housing, and infrastructure activities which can help address population loss.

Regional Arts Plan - Goals, strategies and work activities for State Arts Funds and McKnight Arts Funds are included in these plans.
