


Service demands will exceed our financial means during the 1990's



Living within our means

- Problem is not a lack of revenue
 - State will have \$1.3 billion more to spend
 - Problem is spending more than we have
- Budget gap will be closed by
 - Living within our means controlling costs and reinventing the way we deliver services
 - Not by raising taxes
- New budget process was used
 - Performance budgeting
 - Baseline budgeting
 - Investment initiatives

Spending will increase over \$1.3 billion, without higher taxes




Spending growth will be the lowest in 20 years


Budget solution will meet over 98% of all forecast needs



Services will be protected by redesign & salary growth restraint

- State and local salary restraint will
 - Save over \$600 million and 9,700 jobs
 - Allow time for cooperative service redesign
- Governor supports better public disclosure of public employee compensation costs
 - Both state & local settlements subject to expanded truth-in-taxation
 - Vote required for 1994 property tax increases necessitated by budgets that include higher salary costs

Discretionary in Dation will not be automatically funded Services must be redesigned



All spending areas will receive more funding - none will be cut



Revenues per student will increase by 3.9% & 4.7%




Protecting and serving citizens
