## SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

### Boards and Commissions Issue Team (Reduction in Gubernatorial Appointments)

One of the 48 issues identified by Governor Perpich as having high priority was the reduction in the number of members he has to appoint to various state agencies. This issue, was titled, "Boards and Commissions," and the team leader was Roger Williams, State Planning Agency. A number of individuals from various state agencies who indicated an interest in serving on the Issue Task Force were contacted individually to discuss the issue. A task force, as such, was never convened. A substantial number of additional resource people were contacted to help determine appointments that could be transferred from under the Governor's authority without negatively impacting the effectiveness of the agency. These people included: Tom Triplett, Director of the Planning Agency; Keith Ford, Governor's Office; Roberta Schneider, and the staff of the Open Appointments Commission; Marlene Johnson and Dorothy Dahlenberg; Representative Dan Knuth and Senator Larry Pogemiller, authors of Legislation in the 1983 Session which transferred authority for a large number of agencies from the Governor to department heads and made those agencies discretionary; members of the executive subcabinet and staff from various state agencies.

An associated task, which required a considerable amount of staff time, was to compile an up-to-date list of all the existing task forces, councils commissions, committees, etc. There was no one source of information that was current. Consequently, at least six different printed sources were used to compile the list. Numerous individuals checked and rechecked the list to ensure its correctness. This information is now computerized on the State Planning Agency's Information System and can be easily kept up to date if we are notified of changes when they are made. A copy of the list is included with this report.

After considering the various points of view a Revisor's bill was drafted. The bill proposed changing the appointing authority for 13 agencies, thereby reducing the number of gubernatorial appointments by 111. Draft bills were distributed to executive directors and heads of all affected agencies and departments for review and comment. Bills were introduced in both the House and Senate. Representative Dan Knuth authored HF 1946 and Senator Larry Pogemiller authored SF 1982. Based on feedback from affected agencies and testimony of Senate members, the Senate Government Operations Committee amended the bill. This was felt to be a prudent step to keep the bill non-controversial and better assure its passage during the short session. As a result of the amendments, the number of Governor's appointments will be reduced by 76 instead of the proposed 111. Members of five agencies (35 members) will continue to be appointed by the Governor (see attached summary).

There is some support among legislators for further reducing the number of gubernatorial appointments. If the Governor is interested in doing so, additional legislation could be prepared for the 1985 session.

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**An Alphabetical Listing Of State Boards,

While addressing the issue of gubernatorial appointments, a comprehensive up-to-date listing of agencies was compiled. This list contains information from at least six different sources and does include changes made during the 1984 legislative session in so far as we have been informed of them.

Minnesota Statutes provide definitions for the various types of agencies. The definitions tend to be confusing (ie, a "council" is a "committee" with certain characteristics), and do not readily distinguish differences in roles and responsibilities. An effort to clarify these definitions may be worthwhile.

MS 82, Sec. 15.0597, Subd. 1(a):

"Agency" means (1) a state board, commission, council, committee, authority, task force or other similar multi-member agency created by statute and having statewide jurisdiction.....

MS 82, Sec. 15.012 STATE AGENCIES: DESIGNATION BY TYPE

BOARD An agency in the executive branch, other than a department, having at least one of the following powers:

- a. to perform administrative acts which may include the expenditure of state money
- b. to issue and revoke licenses or certificates
- c. to make rules, or
- d. to adjudicate contested cases or appeals.

Per diem and expenses are paid to members.

COMMITTEE An agency in the executive branch, not having the powers available to boards. whose primary purpose is to advise state officers, departments, boards or other agencies. Per diem and expenses are paid to members.

COUNCIL: A committee of which at least one-half of the members are required to be certain officers or representatives of specified businesses, occupations, industries, political subdivisions, organizations or other groupings of persons other than geographical regions. Per diem and expenses are paid.

ADVISORY

TASK FORCE: A committee or council scheduled upon its creation to expire two years after the effective date of the act creating it or the date of appointment of its members, whichever is later, unless a shorter term is specified in statute. Per diem is not paid; expenses are paid.

COMMISSION No statutory definition found.
